

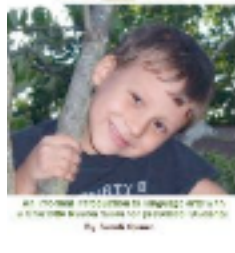
Little Ones

Very Young

Assumes a child is reading fluently, starts grammar instruction. Picture study, narration, copywork, creative writing instruction in poetry, more. Written directly to the child, no teacher prep.

Very Young 2

Reviews basic grammar, assuming a child has been introduced to subject, predicate, noun, verb, and basic capitalization and punctuation. Picture study, narration, copywork, writing instruction, more. No teacher prep.

Language Lessons for the Elementary Child



Elementary

More advanced grammar, contractions, alphabetizing, synonyms, antonyms, compound and run-on sentences, letter writing, poetry writing, picture study, narration, copywork, more.

Elementary 2

Reviews concepts from "Elementary," with more advanced lessons. Writing lessons are more advanced. Additional instruction in writing, picture study, narration, writing prompts, copywork, more.

Secondary

Most advanced level of grammar instruction, assuming child has a good understanding of basics. Advanced writing in different venues, focusing on poetry and creativity. Picture study, intense copywork, narration, writing prompts, more.

Last year of grammar instruction. Continued writing instruction and prompts. Copywork focuses on famous historical speeches. Picture study, narration, more.

Language Lessons for the High School Student

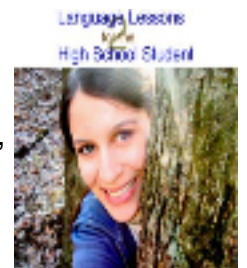


High School

Assumes a child is fluent in English grammatical terminologies and application, and moves into editing practice. Dictation, picture study, and an intense course in story writing from start to finish.

High School 2

Continued practice in editing, dictation, picture study, as well as a complete course in upper level writing instruction, focusing on essays, in different venues (narrative, expository, etc.)
